Obituary and Biographical Detials

Represented Lynchburg and Campbell County in the Virginia Constitutional Convention of 1867-1868 ("Black and Tan Convention"; "Underwood Constitution")

Address comes from 1875-1876 LCD

Wife was blind according to 1880 census

Middle initial may have stood for "Freeman," since his nephew (Allen's son) was named Samuel Freeman Kelso (see marriage certificate)
