Obituary and Biographical Details

From Reminiscences (1896):

Daniel Ligon is interred just below the soldiers' section. He was well known perhaps as any

man in this city for his jovial disposition and his good nature under adverse circumstances. "Dan" as everybody called him, was always ready for a joke or a story, but, notwithstanding was a hard working blacksmith, a work that he seemed to enjoy. He had sown a pretty large crop of wild oats in early life, but at the time Evangelist Earle held his meetings in what was the old Baptist church, he gave his heart to God and his hand to the church, of which he became a worthy member, and died in the faith on the 27th of November, 1885, aged 51 years. He has left many pleasant memories behind him. Beside him lies his son William, who died in the far West and was interred here in October, 1894.
