Obituary and Biographical Detials

Apparently her husband John Scott died between 1900 and 1910, but I cannot find any death or burial record.

1900 LCD: “Belle Scott”, teacher, residence 1314 Church Street

1910 census: no occupation, 609 Sixth Street with three sons Norvell, Oswald, and Duval

1920 census: lived on the Tuskegee campus in the household with President Robert R. Moton
