- Most of our trees have labels somewhere near the base of the trunk, so if you see one you like, you can find out what it is!
- Our goats names are Morris (black & white), Sampson (speckled brown and white ears), & Baxter (solid brown ears). They LOVE peanuts.
- Our herb garden (by the Pest House) has herbs in it that were once used to make medicines!
- We have a Little Public Library here by the swing, across the street from the Chapel.


